## Senior Dies On Beach

**FARMINGTON**  
An 18-year-old North Farmington High School senior died last weekend in Grand Bend, Ontario when a tunnel which he and a friend were digging in the beach collapsed.

Matthew Brett Spears of 2810 Ravenwood Drive, Farmington Township, was pronounced dead at the scene after resuscitation attempts by police, firemen and beach lifeguards proved unsuccessful.

According to Grand Bend police, on Aug. 20 Spears and a friend were on the public beach behind the Lakeview Casino where to see who could dig a tunnel the fastest. A Grand Bend resident saw the youths and warned them about digging too deep in the sand, police said.

No sooner had the youths been warned than the tunnel collapsed on Spears, burying him under six feet of sand, police said. Spear's friend and the local resident summoned the police and began digging to free the youth.

Services for the youth were held Aug. 24 in the Heeneys-Sundquist Funeral Home with Rev. Robert L. Miller officiating. Burial followed in Glen Eden Memorial Park in Livonia.

A member of the Trinity Episcopal Church of Farmington, Spears is survived by his parents, William A. Spears of Farmington Township and Mrs. Rena Doran of Livonia; two brothers, Randy and Gregg; and a sister, Cindy, all of Farmington.

WHILE A student at Schoolcraft in 1969, Stevens was expelled after being convicted by a jury in Livonia District Court of shouting an obscenity at college trustees. Stevens' conviction was later reversed by a circuit judge.

Miss Orr had been arrested in June, 1970 on a disorderly conduct charge. She was a student at Schoolcraft between August 1968 and April 1969 and later earned a certificate in practical nursing from Ferris State College.

The two had been arrested on the bombing charges after state police received an anonymous tip. Though state police had earlier said they were suspects in other area bombings, they were sentenced only the Orchard Ridge bombing.
