

Need For Trunk Line Maintenance Shown

(Continued from Page One) acknowledge the fact that Michigan highways have been well maintained. Snow removal and ice treatment, in contrast with other states are provided on every mile of trunkline highway. Every mile of gravel road is treated for dust in the summer.

State Help Necessary "Should the present system of state maintenance be abolished, we would have the chaotic and confusing picture of 83 different types and standards of maintenance in Michigan. There would be no central responsibility. It would be impossible to mobilize equipment from other sections of the state to fight an emergency in one particular area. There would be no assurance that trunklines which carry the most traffic would be given maintenance preference as they are now. The county line rather than the trunkline might well become the watchword of those charged with this important service to Michigan motorists.

A Large Crew "The state highway department has about 1,200 maintenance employees in the field. Sponsors of this measure apparently regard these men as a great political organization. If fighting snow and ice, 20 foot drifts, and 60-mile-an-hour winds for 12 hours at a stretch, day and night, is fighting the battle of a political organization, then

there can be no quarrel with this view.

"There is no question that House Bill 252 would throw these men out of work. I wonder if the proponents of this measure care to make such a substantial contribution to the relief situation at a time when the relief situation is already so grave.

Have Hands Full "The counties already have their hands full in maintaining local roads. State maintenance is of a higher standard, by reason of the heavier traffic requirements, that it really amounts to a separate field of endeavor than local road maintenance. It is doubtful that the Michigan might as well isolate itself from the rest of the Union.

Would Junk Garages "The state highway department has its maintenance garages scattered throughout the state. House Bill 252 proposes that these garages be junked and their investment lost to the people or become superfluous property of the county road commissions. "House Bill 252 refers solely to state highways. County road commissions have always had maintenance jurisdiction over local roads. The state highway department has never attempted to trespass into this legitimate field of home rule. By the same reasoning, local authorities should not attempt to take over a job which rightfully belongs to the state.
