BALANCED DIET OF PLANT FOOD NEEDED BY GROWING CROPS

CHICAGO.—Growing crops need a balanced diet of plant food from the soil, the same as human beings or livestock need a balanced ration in their foods, a bulletin issued by the Middle West Soil Improvement Committee points out.

"If certain plant food elements are missing from the soil, growing crops will develop weaknesses and a susceptibility to diseases," the bulletin declares.

"For the best crop yields and the rehabilitation of the soil, a careful balance of nitrogen, phosphorus and potash is necessary. Some soils require more of one element than another. Crops likewise vary in their fertilizer needs."

What analysis of commercial fertilizer is best for a farmer to use and how much he should apply will depend on a number of factors. The best way of finding out is to consult the soils and agronomy department of the state college and agricultural stations. They have information readily available and are eager to cooperate.

Old Chairs Gain New Life and Comfort

A bedroom chair with a smart slip cover, removed from an old cream parlor chair is the proud possession of a Kalamazoo homemaker.

The transformation was accomplished by padding the chair generously both to give comfort and for improving the lines. A ten-cents-a-yard print in an attractive design was used for the removable slip cover.

This is just one of many renovated chairs, according to Margaret Linsell, home demonstration agent in Kalamazoo county. Assisted in this county and in others by Jessie Marion, specialist from Michigan State college, women have been adding new beauty to their homes by slip covers, the retying of springs and reupholstering.

Grandmothers' rush-bottom chairs have a new lease on life with seats renewed of cotton, rushes, long loose grass or fiber. Case seats that finally broke through and were gathering cobwebs in the woodshed and attic are good for two generations more with new seats.

Last year a total of 823 cane seats, and 435 rush seats were made by members of groups in 24 counties.

An additional 1823 families reconditioned furniture by tying of springs, reupholstering or making slip covers.

Entire families have entered into the fun and labor of sprucing up the home. A new appreciation for good design, quality of workmanship as well as comfort and beauty has been a result of this project. A savings of over \$1,000 is reported for all home furnishing work in the college extension projects.

INDIANA MARRIAGE LAW NOW IN EFFECT

The Michigan Department of Health reports that a law has been enacted in Indiana governing applicants for licenses to marry. Applicants must submit to tests for venereal diseases. Application for a license must be made in the home county of the bride or in the home county of the bridegroom if the bride does not reside in Indiana; if neither is a resident of the state a license will be refused. Notice of intention to marry must be publicly certified five days before the ceremony.

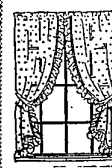
