A new series of classes for diabetics and their families will begin Sept. 13, at 7 p.m. in the Wayne County Health Center, Meridian Road, Elioise. The instruction is under the direction of Family Health Services.

The education by professional staff covers topics which explain the condition of diabetes mellitus, its control and treatment and the relationship of diet. The importance of the diabetic's cooperation with his physician is stressed along with the patient's responsibility in caring for himself in order to lead an active, normal life.

All diabetics regardless of age may attend with written approval from their physicians. Children under 14 should be accompanied by a parent.

The series consists of two-hour classes on six consecutive Monday evenings. Interested persons may register by telephoning the Wayne County Department of Health.

## Xi Delta Plans First Meeting

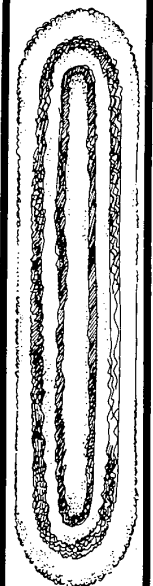
