OAKLAND COUNTY FAIR TO OPEN NEXT WEEK

Mifflord will be the destination of thousands of people next week, all bound for the Oakland County Fair. Mifflord, August and the Oakland County Fair have been so long associated that going to the fair will seem just the right thing to do at this time of year.

The Oakland County Fair is one of the state's oldest, celebrating its 30th annual showing this year. Always it has been recognized as one of the better "little fairs" of the state. For its showing this year livestock exhibits and agricultural aspects are featured. Here will be shown a fine array of draft horses, mules, ponies and saddle horses, cattle, sheep and swine. Judging of livestock will occur on Thursday and all livestock will be paraded before the grandstand every day. Exhibits of fruits, grains and flowers, home economics and clothing will be made in the Oakland County building, as well as many commercial exhibits. Plans are also in the making for an exhibit of antiques by the Edison Institute.

High and PFA groups, of boys and girls are encouraged in that premiums are offered in special livestock classes, and their animals are also eligible to compete in the open.

Farmers will find the exhibit of farm implements and tractors of unusual interest and most of the best known makes will be represented. Farmers will have a chance to see and compare this machinery at close range.

For amusement and entertainment, the fair will present nine events of racine each afternoon, with the riding for saddle horse, Welsh and shetland horses. On Thursday afternoon and evening, the Pine Ridge Follies, a group of singing, dancing, playing stars, were directly from Pine Ridge. On Friday and Saturday, a big circus and rodeo will entertain, with high class animal and circus acts, cowboys and cowgirls in riding, roping and shooting. Entertainment features are the horse-pulling contests on Thursday and Friday, an oat team showing the pioneer way, and on Saturday night, a feature will be the F. W. W. championship drum and bugle corps will come here for a demonstration. Big fireworks displays will close each evening program.

GERMAN'S OLD TIMERS TO PLAY AT NORTHVILLE

The Northville Fair, which opens August 16, will have a first day feature, a baseball game scheduled between the Detroit-Country Old Timers and the Pontiac Old Timers.

These two teams will be composed of a number of past stars of the game and each club will have no less than twelve or fifteen players who will play plenty of ball in the game. Some of the players of each team have been playing ball all the season and are in condition to go through the entire game. Others will give good account of themselves while participating. By Old Timers it must be taken into consideration that most of the players in the Northville Fair game will be men from thirty-five to sixty years of age.

Players who will represent the Detroit-Country team at Northville will include: Fred Fuller, Frank Fuller and other veterans and players who are on the mound while Oliver and Crittenden will be on the receiving end.

The Pontiac Old Timers will be headed by Goodrow Rogers who at one time was an ace on the St. Louis Browns of the American league. He is a catcher and his performance in a game recently at Pontiac proved that he still can make many young fellows take notice.

"Singing Bill" To Urp
Another thing that comes right along with this baseball game of veterans will be the urping of "Singing Bill" Byron. Byron will be aided on the field by two other urpers. Byron is now past sixty years of age and was in the National league as a urper for twenty years. He recently urped a double-header and his urping voice on balls and strikes rang out over the entire field like a loud-speaker. Players in his younger days respected his decisions and was recognized as one of the best arbiters in the game.

State Fish Hatchery Being Modernized

Modernization and extension of facilities at the State fish hatchery located in Grayling are making steady progress, according to the fish division of the Michigan Department of Conservation.

Extensions of the rearing pond system and modernization of ponds is practically completed. A new pump house and equipment is being installed from an shallow well to the hatchery. The pump has been in service more than 25 years.

The pump house encloses a water wheel of modern design to be driven by stream flow, which operates a pump for delivering water from an shallow well to the hatchery. The pump has been in service more than 25 years.

The pump house is set on piling and is constructed of limestone quarried in northern Michigan and transported by CCC labor.

Divining Rods Now In Popular Demand

Freak Information Sought Of U. S. Government.

WASHINGTON—The department of the interior, custodian of the public domain and a great deal else, is one of the greatest recipients of requests for freak information in the United States government. Nearly a million and a half letters come in each year asking for something or other, and a very large number of them want to know where to find a divining rod.

For 90 years, ever since the department came into existence, eager demands have come in having inspiration in the persistent belief that wealth can be obtained by hocus-pocus. About 700 of these letters are received each year.

Various phrases, they all ask for nearly the same thing. One says: "Please tell me whether there is an instrument known as a 'divining rod' with which I may locate minerals which I feel sure must exist in this region."

Other letters inquire, "How do you find water wells with a forked twig?" or "I want to know how to go about getting a government machine to hunt hidden treasure."

Another letter asks: "How may I secure a permit to search for lost treasure? I have information to the effect that a large quantity of silver bars were being transported by the Spaniards in the vicinity of Santa Fe in the 1600s. Being best by Indians, the Spaniards buried the treasure at a place the general locality of which I have learned by consulting an old map that came into my possession."

Others, ethnologically minded, want to know whether Indians are citizens and whether the department can furnish a list of present-day Indian chiefs. With remarkable self-reliance, the authorities regularly send out such a list upon request.

French Army Best, Duce Said in Austrian Crisis
LONDON.—An alleged indirect exchange of compliments on their armies between Adolf Hitler and Benito Mussolini, the two dictators of Germany and Italy respectively, was reported in a book, "Death of Austria," by Martin Fuchs, former secretary to Kurt Schuschnigg, last chancellor of independent Austria. According to Fuchs, Hitler informed Schuschnigg at their conference at Berchtesgaden which preceded the absorption of Austria.

"If Mussolini wanted to help you—which he certainly does not—100,000 German troops will be sufficient not only to push Italy back from the Austrian frontier, but to chase it as far as Naples."

Mussolini, informed of this by the Austrian military attaché at Rome, was said to have replied: "The best army in Europe at present is not the German army or even the Italian army. It is and remains the French army."

British Make Palatable Bread Out of Oat Flour

LONDON.—Research conducted at Swansea Technical college, Wales, is believed to have brought the country within sight of independence of imported wheat or flour in the near future.

The bakery department of the college has produced bread made of oat flour. It is the first time in England at least, that bread has been produced commercially without the use of some wheat flour.

In appearance the oat bread is very similar to ordinary brown bread.

P. S. Jewell, lecturer in bio-chemistry at the college, said: "Oaten bread contains 28 per cent of calories compared with 22 per cent in wheat bread; 7.2 per cent fat, compared with 1.7 per cent; three times as much calcium and 18.1 per cent of protein, compared with 11.1 per cent."

Emigrant From Germany Trades Business With Jew

DUNELLEN, N. J.—Karl Schurr, 58-year-old German immigrant, will return with his family to Germany and his ice business here will be taken over by German Jewish refugee family, it was learned.

The transaction involves property and business rights, Schurr said, adding that he would leave for Germany as soon as his "successor" could come to this country. In Germany, Schurr will take over the business and property of the undisclosed Jew for which he is exchanging his home and ice business here.

"I have nothing against the Jewish people," he said. "If I can help one of these families while still helping my own, so much the better. I like my country, but it is not my country. You know how it is when you are brought up one place and raised in another. I have been in the United States 12 years."
