Filmmaking Is On OR Agenda

An "8 mm Cinematography Workshop" concentrating on basic techniques from script writing to shooting and editing, will be one of six non-credit courses offered by the Orchard Ridge extension division, Oakland Community College, this fall.

The eight-week workshop is open to anyone in the community. Persons will learn cinematography from basic filming, writing and sound production, through to the processing and editing.

It has a \$20 tuition fee and will run at 7 p.m., Tuesdays, beginning Sept. 28, in Birmingham's Seaholm High School.

Registration for this course and several others offered by the college can be completed from 7 to 9 p.m. Tuesday through Friday, Sept. 7 to 9. Late registration will be between 7 and 9 p.m. Sept. 13 and 14 for an extra \$5 fee.

PERSONS can register at Southfield High School, Southfield Lathrup High School and the Orchard Ridge campus, at 1-696 between Orchard Lake and Farmington Roads. Also,

registration will be held between 7 and 9 p.m. in Novi High School on Wednesday, Sept. 8.

Also among the non-credit courses, are a class on "Understanding the Generation Gap" and "Gourmet Cooking and Cake Decorating."

Coordinated by Orchard Ridge counselor Peggy Cratch, the six-week generation gap class will bring in outstanding speakers including ministers, psychologists, sociologists and government officials to explore areas affecting contemporary youth.

A \$15 tuition fee will be charged with \$5 added on for every family member attending. It will meet on the campus between 7 and 9:30 p.m. on Wednesdays beginning Sept. 15.

A HOST of European dishes will be created in the gourmet cooking class at 7 p.m., on Thursdays beginning Sept. 16 with a \$25 tuition fee.

The six-week cake decorating course will begin with simpler rose border designs and end with decorating wedding cakes in the class held at 7 on Tuesday evenings with a \$25 tuition fee.

Other non-credit courses include "The Art of Officiating Baseball" and "The Art of Officiating Wrestling" at 7 p.m. beginning Sept. 15 in Troy High School.

"Kundalini Yoga" will begin at 7 p.m. on Sept. 29 in Birmingham Westchester Elementary School.

The more conventional extension courses in business, history, English, sociology and communications will be offered at various high schools in the area for \$10 per credit hour. Non-residents will pay \$20 per credit.

Schedules of the classes can be obtained from the Community Services office at Orchard Ridge. The last day for registration will be Sept. 14. Classes begin the week of Sept. 13.
