Working newsmen throughout the world recently received a helping hand — at least in its ideal — from The Vatican.

In a 20,000-word pastoral instruction, approved in its entirety by Pope Paul and entitled "The Media, Public Opinion and Human Progress," The Vatican "utterly condemns the violence against newsmen."

Press photographers are particularly grateful for this expressed concern — especially those who must photograph riots, and are dangerously vulnerable to attack from the side, while trying to focus their lenses.

Columnists, editorial writers and other interpretive writers will appreciate another admonition in the document: "The meaning of what the press reports should be brought out by explanation."

Church To Mark 36th Anniversary

By KATHY MORAN This weekend will be a double celebration at Covenant Community Church in Redford Township.

A homecoming program on Sunday will celebrate the return of five former parishioners who left the congregation to work full time in Christian service.

But the homecoming will also be a celebration of 36 years since the founding of the church by the Rev. John L. Drummond, who has stayed with the church through its years of growth.

While most ministers move around in their work, Rev. Drummond turned down several offers in order to be a part of the church's growth from 20 families to more than 700.

"I never felt my work was finished," he said. "It has been exciting and the church has always been growing."

Drummond says. They donated \$50,000 to the missions last year. He can remember when the church was a small struggling group of 20 families and when the church building was a tiny wooden structure in the barren area.

LOCATED AT Beech Daly and Student, the church now owns 40 lots and has two wings for the estimated 725 Sunday school students. It is sandwiched in a residential area and is currently planning to build a student activities building to accommodate the ever-growing youth program.

"I am beginning to marry children whose parents I married," he said. "And I have dedicated infants whose parents I dedicated."

Deep Commitment To Truth Is Urged

Deeper commitment to truth is demanded by all who would help mankind, more than 5,000 Christian Science college students from 31 countries were told recently in Boston.

Both student speakers and guests emphasized the need for commitment to the "truth of God and man" in helping to heal pollution, drug addiction, racism and other problems.

Some 250 students from Michigan attended the three-day biennial College Organization meeting held at the First Church of Christ Scientist. Among those from

Rockington of Plymouth, Cynthia Burt and Andrew Hickman of Livonia and Darryl Carlson of Farmington.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER was Carl J. Welz, editor of The Christian Science Journal, the Christian Science Sentinel and the Herald of Christian Science.

"The truth of God and man is a tremendous force, an irresistible power," he told the gathering.

"Human life is not to be escaped from but to be understood," he said, adding that when it is understood the lack of love in human life "can be eliminated and the truth demonstrated. This demonstration alone can awaken human beings to their capacity to eliminate the causes of war, poverty, disease."

"Ecology and Population" control was the subject of a symposium. Other topics explored at the meeting included racism, international hostility, identity, sex morality, home and family, women's liberation and the drug culture and occultism.

A number of college students spoke out of firsthand experience with spiritual healing, including a Californian; who told how she was freed from dependency on drugs; a Korean who described the protection experienced through prayer in a combat zone in Vietnam; a
