Miss Hamlin first went to India in October 1951, and has completed three terms of service there.

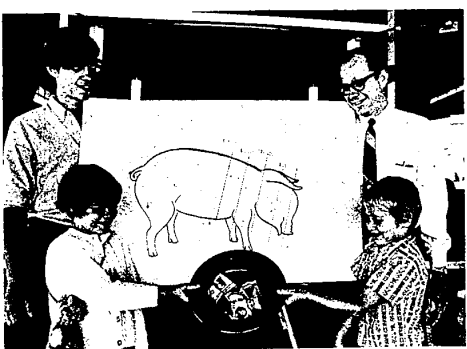
SHE GRADUATED from Central Bible College, Springfield, Mo., in 1946. She took further classes there during the spring semester this year, working towards a degree in Christian education.

'Good Samaritans' Have Day Sept. 5

In a second thrust at raising \$1.5 million for "Project Neighbor," a social concern endeavor, congregations of the American Lutheran Church throughout the country have been asked to designate Sept. 5 as "Good Samaritan Sunday."

Responding to a 1970 convention directive that the Project Neighbor campaign be "spurred on to a successful conclusion," George A. Parks of Los Angeles, national chairman, has addressed a letter to the 4,822 congregations of the church suggesting additional cash gifts.

FUNDS RAISED by the special drive are used to augment a \$500,000 annual appropriation by the ALC, originated in 1968, to alleviate national crisis conditions in community originated projects.
