NEW TRAFFIC LAWS GO INTO EFFECT ON FRIDAY

Radical changes in Michigan's new traffic law, effective Sept. 29, which should be borne in mind by the state's two million motorists

are:

"Stop" signs mean STOP!

Right-hand turns on red light are
prohibited

prohibited.

If a green arrow is shown with the red light, vehicles may cautiously enter the intersection to make the movement indicated by the arrow, but must yield the right-oway to other vehicles, and to pedestrians.

A flashing red arrow with the red light means that vehicles must first stop before making the right jurn.

tirst stop before making the right urn.
Pedestrians should cross streets on green light, athough they may cross on the red if they do not interfere with traffic. When crossing on the green they have the right-toway over turning yehicles.
Pedestrians must walk on the left side on rural highways, facing on-coming traffic. When aidewalks are provided, it is unlawful for pedestrians to walk on the main traveled portion of the highway.
