'Freeze' Is Fraud To HRP Delegates

About 100 members of the Human Rights Party gathered in Farmington Sunday to assess progress on their statewide petition drive and to criticize what they termed "the Nixon Wage-Price Freeze."

HRP activists have been circulating petitions to secure official recognition as a new state political party throughout the summer. Having in hand 12,000 of the required 15,000 signatures, they made plans to conclude the petition drive by next month.

MEMBERS of the 18th Congressional District then introduced a series of resolutions, all of which passed.

The first, introduced by Cal Lippitt of Oak Park, condemned the Nixon economic plan as "repressive," a "wage-price fraud," freezing only "this nation's poor people's poverty and the favored position of the rich," while doing nothing to control profits and dividends.

Lippitt's proposal said "a minimum economic program for the welfare of the people must (1) stop the Indochina war now and declare a peace dividend; (2) cut armaments spending by at least \$40 billion; (3) cut taxes for the low and middle income classes; (4) impose an excess profits tax, particularly on those corporations with government military contracts; (5) declare an income tax exemption on income less than \$6,000 per year for a family of four; and (6) offer a

realistic guaranteed annual income for every family."

A RESOLUTION offered by Mrs. Barbara Halpert, of Bloomfield Township, criticized the Nixon increase in import duties and called for an end to the tariff, saying that "free trade among nations is essential to international harmony, economic survival and peace in the world."

The final resolution from HRP members in the 18th congressional district dealt with the recent Federal Court decision that students in Pontiac must be bused to achieve racial integration.

While supportive of the court's ruling, the resolution concluded: "...the present bussing system is insufficient for the kind of educational and political change necessary. Bussing now tends to reinforce and build the power of the central school boards and weakens community control of schools."

"The educational crisis will only be resolved when all schools, whether bused, or not, establish democratically elected community control boards, consisting of parents, teachers and students, which will determine their own educational destinies."

The meeting took place on the Orchard Ridge campus of Oakland University.
