Easy-to-attend one and two-day workshops are planned for this fall at the Continuum Center at Oakland University. The workshops are part of the new series of Creative Classes scheduled to begin Sept. 28, and are designed for persons interested in decorating their own homes and giving handmade gifts at Christmas.

THE CHRISTMAS workshops will be held on three Mondays, Oct. 11, 18 and 25. The 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. sessions will include quick and easy gift projects to be completed in one day with many more ideas to take home, decorations and tree ornaments and how to design and make your own greeting cards using block prints, woodcuts or rubbings.

A special workshop, "Understanding and Developing Your Child's Creativity" is for parents or those who work with children. Regular eight-week courses include ceramics, woodcarving, figure drawing, fused glass, water color and decorative art for the non-artist. There will also be three-week courses in candlemaking and papier mache.

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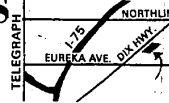
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
