information on what is coming after the wage freeze ends Nov. 12. But we need to move."

"The only disheartening thing is that we've heard - whether fact or fiction - that the board is very close to where it plans on going" with the \$200 offer, Allen said. "If it is, we've got problems. If not, we're still prepared to negotiate in good faith."

Bartman conceded that negotiations have been "going at a snail's pace" but added: "Our big goal is to live within our means."

"We'll have to see what our adjusted position will be" in light of the action in Lansing, Bartman said, "And it looks tight."
