Fund Reaches \$21,000

FARMINGTON
The extra-curricular fund-raisers have almost reached their goal for underwriting the fall programs with some \$21,000 in the bank and outstanding pledges of \$9,000.

Robert Chesley, co-chairman of the drive with Dick Crubeite, said the pledges started coming in after emphasis was given that the money was needed soon for the fall extra-curricular activities.

THE FUND-RAISERS, working through the Farmington Junior Football Association (FJFA), now must raise another \$33,000 to finance winter and spring sports for Farmington schools.

The initial \$24,000 collected will pay for fall sports and all home sports extra-curricular programs for the entire year. The approximate \$33,000 yet

to be raised will finance basketball, wrestling, baseball, track, gymnastics, swimming and tennis teams.

CHESLEY SAID "amazing results" were experienced with the coupon printed recently in the Farmington Enterprise & Observer. "Within the first two days after the coupon was printed," he said, "we received \$1,000 in checks with the coupon printed in the Observer. More checks have come in since."
