Court Halts OCC Strike 2 Weeks

Faculty members from the Orchard Ridge campus of Oakland Community College were back in their classes Friday under a court order after a one-week work stoppage.

The faculty reported to their classes in Farmington after spending the balance of the week in Oakland County Circuit Court attempting to fight an injunction against their strike and trying to negotiate with the administration on their salary schedule.

The salary schedule is the only unresolved issue. The OCC Faculty Association had ratified a contract calling for a \$400 a year increase and \$30 a month cost of living increase on Labor Day, but the board of trustees rejected the contract on Sept. 13.

MEANWHILE, A state mediator from the Michigan Labor Relations Commission will be present at further negotiations by order of Circuit Judge Robert Temple. Negotiations were scheduled to resume Friday afternoon.

An Orchard Ridge spokesman said registration for OCC extension courses will be held this week to the first night of classes scheduled in Southfield High School and Lathrup High School.

Persons can register by reporting to the first class meeting or by going to either extension center during the day. Most classes meet between 6 and 10 p.m. Counseling will be available at the centers.

The short courses, such as cake decorating, gourmet cooking, "Understanding the Generation Gap," and sports officiating, will begin this week because of the faculty strike.

Registration will also be accepted at the first class meeting.

At the same time that Orchard Ridge is getting into the fall term, Oakland University will begin classes Wednesday after a nine-day strike.

Teachers ratified a tentative contract agreement Thursday and formal ratification is set for this week.

Mrs. Dwight Gordon, chairman of the awards program, announced that a letter entitling their cooperation will be sent to all organizations in the area.

They will also be asked to submit information about any environmental improvement projects their organization has instigated or participated in. This would include educational programs or support of legislation as well as actual projects involving anti-litter, anti-pollution, landscaping, conservation, or others.

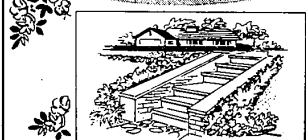

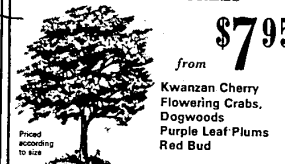
