A reader writes: "I have a large-fuchsia and shrimp plant growing in pois out-doors. Should I bring them inside for winter?

## Storage Fits In Stairwell

Stairwell

Stairwells, usually
spronymous with dead space,
offer anny opportunities for
building in additional storage.
Floor-to-ceiling cabinets
an be extended over stairs
leading to a lower level. The
lower part can be used to stora
off-season clothing and the
topper level for linens and
bankets.
In place of a railing around
an open stairwell, enclosed
shelves of lutz-in-the western
wood can be constructed for
books or displaying collections
of artwork.
Basement stairway doors
often are narrower than the
stairwell. In this situation
there is space between the
doors for storing mops and
brooms.

## Combine **Grass Types**

Tests at the Lawn Institute indicate that some of the newer low-growing bluegrasses, such as Pennstar

bluegrasses, such as Pennstate and Fylking, combine quite weil with colonial bent-grasses. Such combinations in humid areas, and for irrigated golf fairways. Highland and Hollior bentgrasses have been better looking throughout winter when an equal quantity of bluegrass seed was added to the seeding mix. Indications are promising that new bluegrass varieties can be successfully introduced into bentgrass. bentgrass.
