

Gas Station Aids Fund

Clubs Are Limited

FARMINGTON
Use of public school buildings for meetings by non-paying groups will be limited in Farmington School District this year to reduce custodial costs.

Whenver possible, meetings normally scheduled in elementary buildings will be shifted to secondary schools where custodial service is available for a longer time at base pay.

The schools maintain custodial service in Junior highs over a 16-hour period and at high schools for 24 hours, said William Prisk, business administrator. It is therefore unnecessary to bring other custodians in on overtime at these schools.

The wage for head custodians is \$4.11 per hour. Prisk said, and overtime at time and a half amounts to \$6.16 per hour.

Non-paying use of

elementary buildings, where extra custodians are required for night meetings, will be limited to no more than two nights per month per building, the board of education decided.

This may require more than one and possibly several groups to be in a building at the same time, Prisk said, and will probably require some

scheduling on the part of the building principal insofar as use of the all-purpose room, lunch room and media centers is concerned.

Meetings of small groups such as Girl Scouts after school in the afternoon and PTA executive boards where no custodian is needed will be no problem, he said.

sure that is being done at the present time."

"I'm not going to step in," Dr. Smith asserted. "I see no indication that the board in any way has withdrawn authority from the bargaining team. They (the FEA) would be the first to criticize me if I stepped in and began playing a role, and also it's not according to the rules of collective bargaining."

ALLEN insisted that school negotiators are working in a "leadership vacuum" and added:

"It is very clear there will be a strike unless somebody, either on the Board of Education or someone duly authorized to negotiate for the board, is willing to take hold of this and negotiate an economic package."

"There is no question the chief negotiator is that in title only," Allen said, "and that until a person is brought in who, in fact, speaks with the authority of the administration or the board, no progress will be made."
