Some interesting classes are being offered by the Farmington Community Center for the fall season. Registration for the classes will be on Thursday, Sept. 16 and Friday, Sept. 17 at the Center, 24705 Farmington Rd.

Following are the classes offered:

APPLE DOLLS-Mondays beginning Sept. 27, 9:30-11:30 a.m. The making of apple dolls is an old fashioned craft that produces charming character dolls. After the apple faces are carved, they must dry for 21 days. The time between carving and finishing the dolls will be taken up with instruction on doll furniture from equally lovely material but with equally attractive results. Instructor is Mrs. Mary Thrombort, who has been teaching this art for a number of years.

ART FOR CHILDREN (ages 5-7) on Saturdays beginning Oct. 1 at 10 a.m. Sessions in mixed media, \$15 plus \$1 materials charge. Instructor Karyl Hill gives an introduction to art materials and their meanings. The class will offer experiences in sculpture, fused glass, drawing and painting, collage and printmaking.

ART FOR JUNIOR and Senior High Students - mixed media - Wednesdays, beginning Sept. 29, 4-6 p.m. Six sessions at \$15 plus materials charge. Instructor is Karyl Hill. The class will offer drawing and wash, collage, sculpture, fused glass, printmaking, tapestry weaving, macramé. Mrs. Hill has studied at Detroit Society of Arts and Crafts, Cranbrook, Oakland University, and Echol Park Day Camp.

BALLET Mondays beginning Sept. 27 every 45 minutes from 4 to 6:15 p.m. Thursdays beginning Sept. 30 at 4 to 7 p.m. at 45 minute intervals and Fridays, beginning Sept. 24 from 4 to 6:15 p.m. at 45 minute intervals. There are 12 sessions for \$20 with Valerie Jogues as the instructor. Mrs. Jogues is an accredited member of the Cecchetti Council of America, has taught in the Detroit area for 10 years, last year at the Community Center and has

danced with the Detroit City Ballet for three years. Mrs. Jogues will be at the center Thursday, Sept. 16 and Friday, Sept. 17, 4 to 6 p.m. for class registration.

BALLROOM DANCING for adults: Wednesdays, beginning Sept. 23, 8:30-10 p.m., omitting Oct. 20 and Nov. 17. Ten sessions at \$20 per couple with Ricky Dove as the instructor.

BANJO: Mondays, beginning Sept. 27, 8-8:45 p.m. 12 sessions for \$24. Tim Hoy will teach basic finger picking styles and chords on the four string banjo.

BEAD FLOWER MAKING: Wednesdays, beginning Sept. 29, 9:30-11:30 a.m. Eight sessions for \$16 are taught by Marianne Wood. New to this country, but old in France where it is known as fleurs en perles, this craft produces beautiful bead flowers and decorative arrangements otherwise obtainable only from fashionable boutiques at expensive prices. Mrs. Wood taught this art in New York for several years.

BRIDGE I (2 classes) is designed to give the beginner a thorough and enjoyable introduction into the mystique of bridge, hand counting, evaluation and bidding. Classes will be offered Mondays, beginning Sept. 27, 8-10 p.m. and Thursdays, beginning Sept. 30, 1-3:30 p.m., 10 sessions for \$15. Before her move to Farmington, Mrs. Schwehr taught bridge in Belleville adult education programs.

BRIDGE II (two classes), Mondays, September 27, 1-3:30 p.m. and Thursdays, beginning Sept. 30, 8-10:30 p.m. 10 sessions for \$15. Classes taught by Mrs. Schwehr will learn each of the Goren conventions, how to bid it and how to respond to it. Hands are played duplicate style.

CANE WEAVING: Wednesdays beginning Sept. 23, 9:30-11:30 a.m. Five sessions for \$10. Materials extra. Instructor is Abe Johnson. Before caning becomes an lost art, modern antiques have a chance to learn from a professional in this craft how to cane treasured chairs. Students should have a chair in need of a new cane seat, the type with holes already drilled, not grooved.

CREATIVE WRITING for Beginners: Wednesdays, beginning Sept. 29, 9:30-11:30 a.m. Eight sessions for \$20. It will touch on all types of writing: short story, novel, article, poetry, drama, publicity, form, style, writer's jargon, copyright and rights, ideas, references, books on writing will be discussed. Mrs. Florence Purvis, the instructor, has been writing and teaching for many years.

CREWEL EMBROIDERY, beginning Sept. 29, 10-12 a.m. (advanced) on Wednesdays. Beginners are from 1-3 p.m. Ten sessions at \$22 plus materials. Mrs. Albert Francis's class is taught according to methods used at the Wallingford Crewel Studio in Pennsylvania, now the largest in the east. This will be the seventh term for this popular class at the center.

CROCHETING: Mondays, beginning Sept. 27, 1-3 p.m., eight sessions at \$14. Learn to whip up those eye-catching crocheted accessories and garments so much in the fashion news. Instructor Mary Thrombort will teach chain, slip, single, double, treble stitches and their variations.

DRAMATICS - PLAY PRODUCTION (ages 7-12) on Tuesdays, beginning Sept. 28, 4-5 p.m. 12 sessions (plus extra rehearsals) \$20. This group, taught by Ceci Orman, will produce a play which will be presented to the public on Dec. 17, proceeds to benefit the Community Center. The children will participate in creative dramatics, pantomime, play reading, play selection, tryouts, casting, prompting, blocking, stage movement, rehearsals, line memorization, characterization, staging, scenery and performance. Mrs. Orman has been working with children 17 years. She has taught in the area for 10 years.

DRAPERY MAKING: First class will begin Monday, Sept. 27. Second class begins Monday, Nov. 1 (omitted). Nov. 30. Two sessions a week on Monday and Wednesday, 7:30-9:30 p.m. 10 sessions for \$20. Students will learn to measure and figure a job, how to make lined or unlined draperies, how to make pleats and all the other details that go into fine draperies. Mrs. Gaele Lichtman, instructor, has had much experience in all facets of drapery making.

FRENCH For Young People will begin Oct. 2, meeting every Saturday for 10 sessions at \$13. Tuesday, 9 a.m. - beginning for grades 2 and 3; 10 a.m. - Intermediate; 11 a.m. - Beginning for grades 4, 5 and 6; 12 p.m. - Beginning for grades 7, 8 and 9.

GUITAR - BEGINNING and Intermediate classes at \$14. Learn to whip up those eye-catching crocheted accessories and garments so much in the fashion news. Instructor Mary Thrombort will teach chain, slip, single, double, treble stitches and their variations.

LEATHERCRAFT: Beginning Wednesday, Sept. 29, the leathercraft classes will be held from 7:30-9:30 p.m. Seven sessions for \$14. Students will become acquainted with leather tooling, lacing, and methods of fastening. They will make articles of their own choosing. Instructor is Bruce Gabel. Materials charge \$6. Gabel has taught art in the Farmington elementary schools for five years and this year will be at Harrison High School.

MACRAMÉ: Wednesdays, beginning Oct. 6. Adults 1-3 p.m. and teens 4-6 p.m. Five sessions for \$15. The ancient sailor's art of knot-tying is used to make home belts and necklaces, wall hangings and other decorative articles. Mrs. Mildred Webb, instructor, is an accomplished weaver and a pioneer in teaching macramé in this area. She is a member of the creative council of Oakland University Continuum Center.

OIL PAINTING will be held on Tuesdays beginning Sept. 28, 9:30 a.m. - 12 noon or 7:30-10 p.m. Ten sessions for \$35. For adults and high school juniors and seniors, this class will combine basic oil painting and advanced work. Experienced painters will be given advanced experimental projects. The classes are small and instructor Marvin Beerbohm is skilled at giving individual guidance.

PHOTOGRAPHY FOR TEENS: Mondays, beginning Sept. 27, 7:30-9:30 p.m. Ten sessions for \$16. Starting with the basic principles of photography, how to work adjustable cameras, differences in film, use of light meters, lenses, and flash photography, instructor Jim Kirby will go into more complex lighting, exposure and composition problems. He plans to stress composition and basic darkroom procedures.

SEWING: Mondays beginning Sept. 27, 9:30-11:30 a.m. - beginning adults; 1-3 p.m. - advanced adults; 4-6 p.m. - beginning teens.

SPANISH FOR CHILDREN: Saturdays, beginning Oct. 2, 9 a.m. - beginning grades 2, 3; 10 a.m. - intermediates; 11 a.m. - beginning grades 4, 5, 6; 12 p.m. - beginning grades 7, 8, 9.

SPEED READING: Open to students 13 years or older, as well as adults. Classes meet Wednesdays, beginning Sept. 23, 7:45-9:30 p.m. Thursdays, beginning Sept. 30, 7:45-9:30 p.m. Eight sessions for \$50.

SLYMNASTICS: Thursdays beginning Sept. 30, 1:15-2:45 p.m.; 10 sessions for \$22. To look your best for the holidays, try slimming down and toning up the fun way with instructor Ricky Dove.
