FUTURE OF STATE DEER HERD IS IN QUESTION

Conservation problems of the biennium which face the incoming Michigan legislature involve not only difficult decisions about the future of the state's deer herd and Great Lakes fisheries, but include also some necessary attention to the woodchuck, the opossum, and the careless small game hunter.

The conservation commission is asking discretionary power to open the season on antlered deer in regions where the winter food has been so diminished by overbreeding as to endanger the survival of herds occupying the barren yards. To check the alarming slump in whitetail catches by the state's commercial fishermen, the commission supports the drastic proposal to suspend the taking of whitetail for five years, and will seek cooperation of other states bordering the lakes on a joint ban.

Now that the upland game bird population has been adjudged able to take it, by the conservation department's game division, the commission is recommending extension of the upland game bird season to 30 days. To take advantage of advances of modern refrigeration, extension of the time after the season close when game may be in possession is suggested also.

With deaths and accidents among small game hunters equaling or exceeding those among deer hunters, extension of the five-years-without-a-license penalty to the careless rabbit and bird hunter is urged. The part-year protection of opossum and woodchuck proposed is in recognition of the place of these lowly creatures in the game scheme.

Among new sport fishing proposals are stiffer creel and season limits on panfish and limitation of trotters' rainbow and lake trout catch by weight. Some conservation clubs are advocating extension of the requirement of a sport fishing license to Great Lakes waters. Individual legislators are expected to propose numerous other changes.

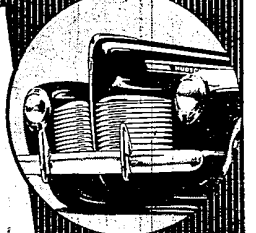
