beginning the week of Oct. 4. Six two-hour lessons cost \$18, and students will make fashion skimmers while learning basic methods.



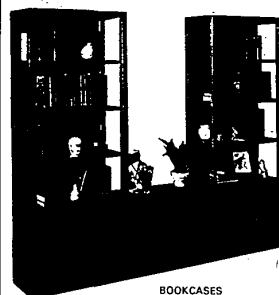
