During 1940 Season

Apparent increased kill of deer increased kill of deer in the upper peninsula during the 1940 season is indicated by counts of animals brought across the stratts, and permits issued for transportation or deer throught Wisconsin. Deer brought across the stratts since November 15 totaled, 7,789 compared with 7,602 in 1939. Permits issued by conservation officers in the west end of the upper peninsula for transportation of deer through Wisconsin total 785. The 1939 total was 663. More foxes and bobcats, less coyotes and wolves were taken by lower peninsula sportsmen hunting above the straits: eight coyotes during deer season this year, nine in 1939; five wolves this season, 18 last, and saven bobcats this season, 19 last, and saven bobcats this season, 19 last, and saven bobcats this season, none last.

Game Officers to Keep Sharp Watch on Deer

Sharp Watch on Deer

Beginning with the new year, conservation officers on routine patrols, game area managers and members of the conservation department's game division staff are keeping a sharp watch on the condition of the state's deer herds. Heavy deer concentrations will be reported, as will areas in which tood shortages appear likely too shortages appear likely too curu. Important wintering areas will be mapped.

Investigations to be carried on during coming weeks will add to the fund of information the department has gathered during the last 13 whiters. During that period 294 "yards" covering over 500 square miles in the lower peninsula have been investigated. Similar investigations in the upper peninsula have been conducted in 257 yards covering 1433 square miles.
