\$500,000 more for teacher salaries, an item which could rise significantly when negotiations are completed; \$6,000 more to replace vehicles, \$700 more for fleet insurance, \$6,000 more for mechanics, and \$2,000 more for bus driver training; \$6,000 more for heating fuel, \$1,000 more for water and sewer and \$4,000 more for electricity; \$112,700 more for hospitalization insurance, \$3,000 more for disability insurance, \$16,000 more for group life insurance, \$11,000 more for workman's compensation premiums, \$5,500

more for property insurance and \$200 more for interest on short term loans.
THE PROBLEM, which has faced the school board for many months now is that the \$200,000 increase in revenues is not sufficient to meet the rising costs across the board. Because certain costs must be absorbed, such as Blue Cross dues, trims are made in other areas—reducing the custodial staff from 110 to 88 and having classrooms cleaned every second day instead of daily.
The proposed budget unveiled at Tuesday night's public hearing by the board reveals the delicate maneuvering of accepting those uncontrollable higher costs and deleting programs, services and persons to balance at \$15.5 million.
As in past years, the \$15.5 million budget, \$9.5 million comes from local property tax (an increase of \$78,700) and \$5.5 million from state aid payments (an increase of \$29,800).
As in past years, the burden of supporting schools is shifting to local taxpayers who are paying for the greater part of the increased costs.
The \$124,700 extra income from local property taxes is

due, not to hillage increases, but to increase in state equalized value of properties and new properties being added to the tax rolls.
Because state aid formulas are designed to help those districts with the least ability to pay, Farmington schools receive less in state aid than it would if local assessments remained level.

THE KEY to examining the budget is to observe that, in spite of the many cuts made, the district must still spend more than last year.
Only by making the cuts in counselors, library services, music and art consultants, etc. could the district balance the budget and avoid a deficit.
The average wage-earner whose income has only increased by \$900 will continue paying his bills and buying necessities, and then make the necessary reduction in the quality of food eaten, type of or quantity of clothing worn and entertainment.
A \$15.5 million school district will pay its bills and provide necessities and then trim where it can by reducing classroom services where it can control costs because \$900,000 is less than inflation will consume.
