MICHIGAN QUAIL AS BIG AS THOSE FROM OUTSTATE

Southern Michigan quail compare favorably in size with quail of other states, according to conservation department game men, who are inclined to discount fears of some sportsmen that Michigan quail are inbreeding with bad effects on the stock.

Weights of 71 adult birds collected from a number of southern counties between 1932 and 1940 averaged six and three-quarters ounces, with the largest bird weighing 8.8 ounces. Reports from other states indicate an average weight for bob-whites is between five and one-half and seven ounces.
