Michigan Births Near All-time High in 1940

Births in Michigan in 1940 were 10,000 more than they were only four years ago, and the provisional total of 99,139 reported to the Michigan Department of Health is only a few hundred under the all-time record of 1937. The total that year was 99,340.

"Records show that births are associated with economic conditions, for there are fewer births following depression periods and more births in good times," said Dr. H. Allen Meyer, State Health Commissioner. "Births dropped 8,000 in 1931, another 5,000 in 1932 and still another 5,000 in 1933, when the low point of recent years was reached, with 89,412 births. Better times recently have seen gains of 5,000 in 1938, and 5,000 in 1940."

Figured on the 1910 final census population of 5,556,106, the 1940 provisional birth rate is 18.86 births per 1,000 population. On the basis of revised population estimates, this is the highest rate since 1930, when it was 20.4.

KENNEDY URGES CRUSADE TO CUT AUTO FATALITIES

With a sharp upsurge in traffic movement already being felt as a result of the defense industrial boom, State Highway Commissioner C. Donald Kennedy this week urged motorists to join in a crusade against the ever-mounting accidental death toll.

"When we stop to realize that Michigan automobile fatalities during 1940 totaled 1,622," Kennedy said, "we can readily see the necessity for an intensified offensive against this traffic scourge."

In addition to the increased use of highways because of the national defense program, Kennedy called attention to the fact that surveys of the 1941 tourist outlook indicate that touring this year will reach record proportions in Michigan.

Said Kennedy: "There is no doubt but that traffic on Michigan highways this year will set an all-time high mark and greatly surpass the 14 billion vehicle miles recorded in 1940. As a result, we must be more careful of our driving than ever so many lives are not to be sacrificed needlessly."

While the state highway department is constantly striving to develop a highway system as nearly trouble-proof as it is possible, Kennedy pointed out that it is still up to the individual motorist if the accident toll is to be held to a minimum.

"Although in the past traffic fatalities have climbed as automobile travel increased," Kennedy said, "it is entirely possible to reverse this condition. With safer highways and with motorists more cautiously because of conditions created by the increased flow of traffic, this death rate can be halted and even reduced."

Conservation Jobs Open

Several jobs in conservation department fish hatcheries and rearing stations will be filled with successful candidates taking examinations to be conducted March 29 by the state civil service commission for "fish culture aide C." positions. The work consists of maintenance of hatchery buildings and grounds as well as such tasks as assisting in spawning-taking and feeding small fry.
