"The Bank Dick" is the story of Elbert Souds, a scholar, gentleman and judge of good grape who hasn't worked since he won a bankcheck jackpot; his marriageable daughter, played by Una Merkel, whose engagement is being held up pending economic improvement; Mackley O. Greene, played by Dick Purcell, who is a harassed motion picture executive. In the supporting cast are Shemp Howard, Franklin Panborn and Cora Witherspoon. Put these characters all together in any small town at the present time, and you will have a story in "Fields" style which will fit the characters.

"Keeping Company" is a comedy drama, starring Ann Rutherford as Mary Thomas and John Shelton as Ted Foster.
