Regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Farmington held April 17th, 1941.

Called to order by Mayor Gildemeister at 8:15.

Commissioners present: Hamlin, Nacker, Bagnall, Otis, Hulet and Griffith.

Mayor Gildemeister ordered a vote taken for the election of a Mayor Pro Tem. Moved by Bagnall and supported by Nacker that Hamlin be named Mayor Pro Tem. Carried. All yeas.

Mayor Gildemeister appointed the following committees:

Bureau of Public Works—Hamlin, Bagnall, Griffith.

Police and Fire—Hulet, Nacker, Public Buildings—Griffith, Otis, Nacker.

Cemetery—Griffith, Hulet.

Bureau of Finance—Bagnall, Otis, Hamlin.

Water—Nacker, Hamlin.

Ordinance—Otis, Hulet.

Motion made by Hulet and supported by Bagnall the committees be confirmed. Roll Call: Hamlin, Nacker, Bagnall, Otis, Hulet, Griffith. Carried. All yeas.

Resolution made by Bagnall as follows:

"Be it resolved that due notice be taken of the following: That the City Commission of the City of Farmington extend a vote of appreciation to Emory Hatton who

has been a member of this Commission for the past fifteen years, and to Harold Oldenburg, a member for the past eight years, for their continuous and faithful service to the people of this community in their capacities as commissioners." Carried. All yeas.

Motion made by Hamlin and supported by Nacker that William Mass be appointed as Superintendent of Public Works and Harvey Blouch be appointed Assistant Superintendent of Public Works. Carried. All yeas.

Motion made by Nacker and supported by Otis that Griffith and Hulet be appointed to the Board of Appeals. Carried.

Motion made by Hamlin and supported by Otis that the City of Farmington pay the premiums on the bonds issued for the City Treasurer, City Clerk, Two Justices of the Peace and Two Constables as follows: City Treasurer, \$10,000.00; City Clerk, \$5,000.00; Constables, \$1,000.00 each; and Two Justices of the Peace, \$500.00 each. Roll Call: Hamlin, Nacker, Bagnall, Otis, Hulet and Griffith. Carried. All yeas.

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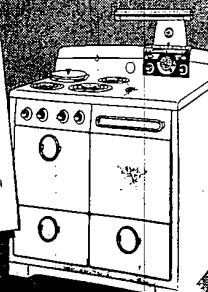
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
