HUDSON RIVER FERRY IS VERY ACCOMMODATING

A ferry service that is available by telephone exists between Saeden Landing and Dobbs Ferry, N. Y., on the banks of the Hudson River. It is believed to be the second oldest ferry service in New York State, and next only to the Staten Island service in New York harbor. The ferry was founded in 1839, and until recent years transportation was by sailing craft, operated much of the time by the Dobbs and Saeden families for whom the communities were named. Though not an accurate counterpart of the "Tonerville Trolley," the Saeden Landing Ferry has shown similar concern for its patrons' convenience, and those detained in the city too late to catch the last boat have only to telephone ahead to the skipper, in order to be accommodated by a special trip.

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
