

## JOHN GRACE SCHOOL PLANS HOT LUNCHEES

Children attending the John Grace school, Southfield Township, may enjoy hot lunches next fall if plans being made now by school officials materialize. The school has asked the Southfield Community Presbyterian church for permission to use the church kitchen and kitchen for serving the lunches.

The lunches would be prepared and served by women in WPA employment and the project would be under the supervision of a member of the Pontiac social welfare board. It is connected with the WPA and the United States surplus commodities.

To secure the hot lunch program the school must arrange for the room for serving, and pay 25 percent of the cost. Surplus commodities supplies storage, eggs, canned

milk, flour, butter, lard, and fruit in season. The school has no kitchen.

Officials of the Southfield church have postponed reply to the school request until they have had time to investigate it thoroughly. They are expected to take action regarding the plan.

It has also been suggested that a neighborhood garden plot be started to provide vegetables for canning. These could later be served to the school children. The WPA will supply a man to care for the garden and women to can the garden products.

Cost of the hot lunches to the school children would be about ten cents each. In some cases, investigated by the school, there would be no charge if the child's family cannot afford it. About 4,000,000 school children throughout the United States are already being supplied daily with hot food under this project.

## FORT CUSTER TO HAVE MODERN MOVIE THEATERS

Military counterparts of the familiar Roxy or Rialto, the brilliant marquees and lavish interiors of most civilian theaters but meeting the same entertainment needs in streamlined fashion, are provided for in the construction program which has made Fort Custer one of the nation's major military centers.

Three large theaters, comparable in size to those in most medium sized towns, and one smaller theater, are included in the fort expansion program. Two are now in operation and two others are nearing completion. Private builders were awarded contracts to erect the theaters by Captain Alfred B. Plamert, the fort constructing quartermaster.

With a combined capacity of approximately 3,000 the theaters will accommodate some 6,000 persons or nearly a third of the Fort Custer personnel, at the two daily showings. On Sundays, when there are three shows, 9,000 patrons could be accommodated.

The theaters are one phase of the general army program to provide facilities for entertainment, recreation, athletics and other leisure-time activities for the thousands of men now in training in various units of the 5th Division and in attached groups. A special theater is provided for the thousands of Michigan and Illinois soldiers who stop at Fort Custer at the weekend reception center for a few days immediately after their induction into the service and prior to their assignment to units for training.

## Sharptailed Grouse Found Near McMillan

Livestock of two unbanded sharptailed grouse at McMillan by Oscar M. Bryens, amateur bird bander cooperating with the conservation department, marks a new milestone in the eastern progress of this game bird. Sharptails have been released east of McMillan at Trout Lake, but the birds captured by Bryens are the first known to have moved this far east of their own accord.

Bryens also captured 13 prairie chickens, three of which were sent to the Kellogg bird sanctuary near Battle Creek. The sharptails and the other 10 prairie chickens were banded and released.
