HOLLAND GETS READY FOR TULIP FESTIVAL

TULIP FESTIVAL

The Annual Tulip Festival held at Holland, Michigan, has focused attention on that area for the past 12 years with the result that lover half a million visitors come for the blooming season. The 1941 festival dates, May 17 through 24, are set to coincide with the bloosoming of the tulips, of which there are at least a million in the municipal plantings, bordering miles of city streets, beedless the 2,00,000 at the hearby tulip farms. 3,000 Hollandres then don the colorful costumes and quaint wooden shoes of intelligent forefathers and stage a series of pageants, parades and exhibits. Tulip Time started out as a flower festival but a floral-folk exposition in which the Dutchman's pride tion in which the Dutchman's pride of ancestry has resulted in the re-

of ancestry has resident in the vivial of many traditions of Old Holland.

The dune-lined shore of Laks Michigan, in terrain and soil conditions is similar to that of the homeland and the Dutchman found his bulbs did very well in this new world location. In May of last year, the invasion of Holland by the Germans meant that no bulbs would be forthcoming from the Netherlands. American gardeners found that nine tenths of their usual supply of bulbs was unobianable. In the effort to locate a domestic supply, they swung their searchlights over the United States and Michigan's Dutchmen found themselves in the limelight, and they are now looked upon as the mainstay of the American supply. Here it is estimated that \$4,000,000 are invested in the business with between 5 and, 6 million tulps available for the 1941 market.

The cutting off of the supply of imported tulp bulbs may provide America with the opportunity to find a place in the tulip industry.


