Ap.roximately 8.115 bushels of surplus wheat will be taxable in Farmington and vicinity under the new Foderal Wheat Marketing Act. This is the figure offreed by Lee G ii d em eister concerning the amount of wheat stored last year in Farmington Mills. Although his is not too large a wheat growing section many farmers will be af-fected here by this act. Much resentment has been ex-pressed by wheat farmers through-out the United States, at this fed-eral act, which calls for a 49 cent o bushel taxo all wheat raised in excess of the allotted 15 acres is the africultural Adjustment.
