TEN YEARS AGO (August 20, 1931)

Little encouragement appeared for the efforts of Farmington officials to install stop lights at the Grand River intersections of School street and Power avenue at the meeting of the City Commission Monday night when Mayor Arthur Lamb reported on his findings. Mayor Lamb revealed that the state officials had been advised of the situation and had promised action in sending representatives here to inquire more only into the situation.
