TWENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO (Friday, September 29, 1910)

Fell 32 Feet, Injuries Fatal

J. W. Hatten, one of the pioneer residents of this village fell with the collapse of a silo on the Nichols farm, on which he was working last Friday afternoon about 1 o'clock and received injuries from which he died three hours later. Mr. Hatten was putting up a silo on the farm of the Nichols Brothers, three miles north of town and had the structure nearly completed and was on top of the silo, a distance of 32 feet, when the strong wind seemed to twist the whole structure and it came crashing down. Mr. Hatten was on the ground, Mr. Hatten and his helper going with it, the latter not being seriously injured.
