Michigan Conservation Week Set by Governor

Once beautifully blessed with mighty forests, in which wildlife abounded, and with luscious streams and clear lakes containing the world's greatest supply of inland fish, Michigan went through a hectic era in which our natural resources were stripped bare, our wildlife slaughtered and many species made extinct, our land left barren, our scenic features eradicated.

In recent years, through education, through restocking and replanting, through public and private cooperation to save and improve what was left, Michigan has regained her topmost ranking as a state of beauty, a mecca for sportsmen, and has become the nation's leading tourist and resort state. Our wildlife, woods, waters and scenic areas annually attract more visitors than any other state, and are the source of a revenue for our citizens, and our government second only to the automobile industry.

The Michigan United Conservation Clubs now plan a Michigan Conservation Week from October 5 to 11, as the first annual effort to focus intensified national attention on our outdoor attractions and our state and private conservation programs.

Special commemorative stamps will be issued by the conservation clubs, illustrating various aspects of Michigan conservation, such as deer, pheasant, trout and lake shore scenes. Revenues from these stamps will help finance the conservation programs, educational work and other projects of direct benefit to Michigan. The stamps will be distributed through the 115 affiliated organizations of the United Conservation Clubs, as well as through Garden clubs, schools and civic organizations.

I hereby proclaim the week of October 5 to 11, 1941, as Michigan Conservation Week, and call on our citizens to cooperate by purchasing the conservation stamps, using them on mail to advertise Michigan's natural attractions, and to join in the various public programs which will stress the value of conservation of our natural resources as an integral part of the national defense and as a practice which reflects most favorably to the general public benefit.
