A conductor's solo and a hunter's blast (successful?) at a passing flight of ducks will be among the attractions when the Plymouth Symphony opens its 26th season this Sunday afternoon (Oct. 17) at 4.

The two "solo" roles, one for Wayne Dunlap and one for Herbert Woolweaver, are part of a new "Prelude and Celebration," written by Robert W. Jones to mark the symphony's first performance in the new Plymouth High

School Auditorium, located on Joy Road, just west of Canton Center Road.

Also on the program will be Beethoven's Symphony No. 9 (Choral), starring the Kenneth Jewell Choral.

Jones, who is composer-in-residence at Schoolcraft College, describes his new work as a combination of agony and celebration.

IT CENTERS on the agony of waiting. The symphony had been hoping all last year that the new auditorium would be

available for use for each "next" concert. Plymouth's Central High School and its folding chairs left something to be desired - comfort - and it was promised that acoustics would be much better in the new auditorium.

Jones has tied the waiting theme with the passage of time. In the beginning, the spring of 1970, the basic theme is carried out by the strings and reflects a happy expectation, with an almost byzantine quality.

THE LIGHTHOUSE's new single recording release, "One Fine Morning," is rapidly climbing to the top of the nation's recording charts.
