U. S. NAVY MODIFIES PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

A relaxation of physical standards for enlistments in the U.S. Navy and the Naval Reserve was announced this week by the Navy Department. In commenting on this action, the Navy Department announcement stated that numericated on the hasis of minor physical defects will, because of the modification of physical standards, be encouraged to re-apply for enlistment in either the regular Navy or the Naval Reserve for the duration of the emergency.
