

## New Courses Excite C'ville

The opportunity to take new courses this year has excited students of Clarenceville High School, according to Principal Ray Renbarger.

Curricular offerings in art, physical education and in the social studies departments were reorganized, modified and approved by the Clarenceville Board of Education last string.

CHANGES in the art department include the addition of courses in the specific media as well as a general introductory course in exploratory art.

Other new classes include beginning and advanced painting and drawing, beginning and advanced ceramics and independent study.

All art classes are offered on a semester basis. As a result, beginning courses are offered the first semester and the advanced the second.

Changes in the physical education department were designed to appeal to student interest in the selection of physical education courses. In fulfilling the year graduation requirement in physical education and in electing courses beyond the requirement, a student may now elect any of the following classes: team sports 1 and 2, individual sports 1 and 2,

gymnastics, basic swimming and advanced swimming. With the exception of swimming, which is co-educational, all courses are offered separately in men's and women's physical education departments.

IN THE SOCIAL studies department, many significant changes were made.

The two-semester 10th grade United States history class was divided into three semesters: 1763-1860, 1860-1918 and 1918 to the present. Students may elect two of the three courses.

In American government, students have four semester courses available to them. They are American government, comparative government, problems of democracy and constitutional law.

Urban affairs is another totally new course in the social studies department and is being received enthusiastically by students, according to Dr. Renbarger. He adds that two other significant changes have taken place. The business education department is offering for the first time to ninth graders a course entitled introduction to business.

Independent study in English will be made available to superior senior students in the second semester of the school year for those who have already completed a major in English.
