"Ifeel that Congress, due to this lack of sufficient scientific support, has in too many in, stances been unable to respond effectively to scientific issues; and it has fallen to the executive branch to evaluate the impact of a particular new technology and find a solution to any resulting problems. "This pattern has reco-

"This pattern has reoc-curred too many times over the years affecting the ability of Congress to exercise an effective leadership role in terms of anticipating the problems and opportunities raised by scientific and technological developments.

\*\*WHAT IS REQUIRED is a staff organization whose sole purpose is to provide the legislative branch with competent, unbiased in-formation concerning the physical, economic, social, and political effects of the applications of specific technological issues," declared Esch.

Esch earlier this year sponsored a bill in in the Husus of Representatives to establish an "office of technology assessment" in the legislative branch. The basic responsibilities and duties of this office would be to provide an early warning of the probable impacts, positive and negative. of the applications of technology and to develop the coordinate information which may assist the Congress in determining the relative priorities of programs before it.
