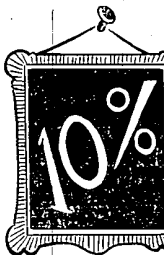

All this was a part of the company's program depicting a century of progress in threshing and farm power. It was at nearby Rochester, Wis., that Jerome J. Case began the development of the company bearing his name.
