**Jobs For 9,000 Youth**

School dropouts whose financial needs are for family assistance; those who need money for extra-curricular activities; to support continuation of a college education; for religious preparation; and for those who are uninvolved in school programs and need legitimate use of their leisure time.

The program would not be a replacement for present school programs, Baumunk says, but would supplement those services already in the area.

The committee has recommended that the daily operation and administration of the service be the responsibility of the vocational education department of Farmington Schools.

Primary functions would be to: issue work permits; assist employers; develop working relationship with school counselors, employers, MESC and other community organizations; provide jobs ranging from temporary part-time to regular full time; provide in-depth job counseling; promote positive attitudes in community towards creating jobs for youth; and maintaining records for evaluation purposes.

It is recommended that the service be guided by an advisory committee of a representative from the

township, city, school district, Chamber of Commerce, and at least one youth from each high school.

BAUMUNK suggests that the facility be located outside the school in an easily accessible area with enough parking space.

Baumunk will be exploring all sources of county, state and federal aid and will meet Jan. 20 with the director of federal grants for Oakland County. The official budget will be presented to the township, city and schools by Feb. 1.

The proposed budget calls for hiring a placement manager to work full time at a

salary of \$9,000 with a secretary at \$5,500.

Other projected costs include: rental of office space, \$3,000; equipment, \$1,000; and supplies, \$1,900.

Various government and community leaders have agreed to the concept of the program.
