With each return form is a get of accompanying instructions, and these instructions should be carefully read by the taxpayer before making his return.

Returns for the calendar year
1942 must be filed not later than
March 15, 1943, They may, be
filed by mailing to the Collector of
Internal Revenue of the appropriate district in which is located
the legal residence or principal
place of business of the taxpayer.
If the return is filed by mailing,
it should be posted in ample, time
to reach the Collectors office on
or before March 15, 1943. Returns
received later than the due dance
res subject to a penalty variable
according to the lateness in filing.
