Edward Tawyea and Eva Bodah had been married Jan. 11, 1912 in Hibbing, Minn. They repeated their wedding vows in a Detroit church on their 25th anniversary and in St. Agatha when they celebrated 50 years of marriage.

Philosophy Professor To Address YW Meeting

Dr. Jean Houston, director of the Foundation for Mind Research in New York City, will be the guest speaker at the annual meeting of the YWCA of Western Wayne County.

The meeting will be held in the Ford World Headquarters building in Dearborn on Wednesday, Jan. 26, with a reception at 6:15 p.m. and dinner at 7. Reservations must be made by Jan. 18 by calling the YWCA, 1034 Monroe, Dearborn. Cost of the dinner is \$6 per person.

Dr. Houston's topic for the evening will be "Genius Creativity in the Turned-On Mind." She is associate professor of philosophy at Marymount College, Tarrytown, N.Y., and author of several books and articles.

She was one of the pioneers in the scientific study of the effects of LSD on human personality and has pursued an extensive non-drug study of altered states of consciousness. Dr. Houston was recently voted one of America's outstanding college teachers by several student associations.

The YWCA volunteer of the year award will be presented by Mrs. Arthur Whetley of Dearborn, last year's winner. Mrs. Ellis Clifton of Inkster and Barbara Newman of Dearborn will present the Y-Teen awards to outstanding members.
