## Rouge Talk Set By Army, WRC

A report on floods and flood potential in the Upper River Rouge flood plain will be made at 8 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 9 in the Livonia City Hall, 33001 Five Mile.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will present relevant information from a recent report concerning parts of Livonia, Farmington Township, Redford Township and the City of Detroit.

Co-sponsors of the meeting with the Corps of Engineers are the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) and the Water Resources Commission of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources.

The report covers also the Minnow Pond Drain, Bell Branch and Tarabusi Creek and is part of a comprehensive study of the Rouge River basin undertaken in recent months by the Corps of Engineers.

Purpose of the meeting is to present information that will be of critical value for planning, zoning, subdivision platting, storm drainage, sanitary sewer facilities and for parks and recreation multi-purposes, Paul Reid, AID, PCP, SEMCOG Regional Planner said.

The report will be made by Maurice Rapkin, chief of flood plain management services for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Detroit District.



## \$1 Badly Spent On Booklet

Q. I recently purchased a booklet on drug abuse that was being sold door-to-door for \$1. But now I wonder if this was a legitimate thing or if I had been taken in.

(This from an anonymous woman who left her copy of the booklet at the offices of the Community Commission on Drug Abuse for evaluation.)

A. We've studied the booklet in question, "Drug Abuse in Livonia and Westland" at some length.

Wow!

Well, let's assume that the author of this booklet was sincere and well-intentioned and that the dollar he asked for it merely reflected the time and trouble involved in collecting and presenting the material, and that this dollar was not intended as a source of profit only.

This publication was born without benefit of proof-reading. Mis-spelling is rampant. But this is only the beginning.

Our favorite entry is that under the heading "Cocaine." Cocaine here is listed as a narcotic. It is not, neither medically nor legally. It is described as "stupor-producing" whereas in point of fact, it is a profound stimulant.

It is claimed to have a "great capacity for addiction." It does not. A gram (about 1/30 of an ounce) is said to sell for \$20 and an ounce to sell for \$80. Simple arithmetic would show that an ounce should sell for \$600 rather than \$80. A "spoon" is quoted as selling for \$20 - obviously less than a gram - whereas a "spoon" is generally at least twice that amount.

A good second would be the category THC. The impression is given that this potent extract of marijuana is actually available in this area. It isn't. THC is fantastically difficult to produce: It's equally difficult to maintain that to be kept at low temperatures and should be bottled under nitrogen.)

Last year somebody actually got a good dose of THC on the West Coast - from someone calling himself "The Cosmic Traveller." This event was so exceptional as to receive national press coverage. We're given to understand that this is an every day occurrence in this area.
