

Miss Arnt Gun Victim

Miss Barbara Arnt, 36, of Farmington, was fatally shot Sunday near Schoolcraft and Grand River in Detroit.

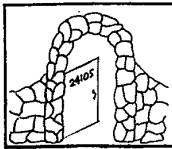
Police believe the incident was an accidental shooting but have yet to recover the gun and are looking for a 25-year-old man for questioning.

Miss Arnt had attended an all-night party given by the Branded Motorcycle Club at 14218 Grand River, Detroit. She had been sleeping on a couch at about 6:40 a.m. Sunday when the fatal shot was fired into her. Police are searching for David Stencil, 26, a close friend of Miss Arnt's.

Latest report is that Detroit police have ruled out homicide and are investigating the death on the basis it was caused by an accidental shooting.

Freeman Sentenced

Louis Freeman, 23, of Pontiac, has been sentenced to one year in Jackson State Prison on a reduced charge of attempted breaking and entering.

Freeman pleaded guilty on Jan. 21 before Oakland Circuit Judge William Beer, who sentenced him. Beer said the light sentence was given because Freeman will be going back to prison on a parole violation and owes seven years on a previous charge of breaking and entering.

Freeman was arrested Nov. 17 by Farmington Township Police and charged with breaking and entering Perry's Drugs of 30850 Orchard Lake, Farmington Township.

Freeman had decided to plead guilty after the second day in court with the jury already picked for the trial.

Farley Jailed

James G. Farley, 35, of Ft. Worth, Texas, has been sentenced to Oakland County Jail after being convicted of defrauding an innkeeper.

Farley pleaded guilty to larceny under Farmington Township ordinance on Jan. 12 before Farmington District Judge Michael J. Hand. He was fined \$54 or five days in jail. Farley failed to pay the fine and was jailed.

He was arrested on Jan. 12 by Farmington Township Police and charged with defrauding the Holiday Inn at 10 Mile and Grand River in the township. Police say Farley had accumulated a bill of \$135 between Dec. 26-29 and left the premises without paying.
