October 24, 1943

Dear Mom and Dad:
Well today is the day of rest. We had a good meal this noon. Turkey and trimps, bought them with money from the company fund from the Italian farmers.

We were honored with a visit by Colonel Ritter today, also a news correspondent from the Chicago Sun.

Received "caden" rations, one box of cookies and wafers, one tootsie roll, one waletto, and two packs of gum. Will greatly appreciate your Christmas boxes when they arrive, especially chocolate candy as we don't get chocolate at all.

We are having a band concert by the Regiment Band. It reminds me of playing in the High School Band back home.

Received Division Insignia. It is a Red Steer's head in a black circle.

The engineers have finished building a shower and we will soon be able to get a bath.

We are now allowed to tell you that we have been in battle, and I came out without a scratch, cut or bruise.

Have met a lot of nice Italian people. They are very friendly toward us. They have been hard hit by this war, more so than any other people I have seen.

We have quite a few grapes but miss having an orange or banana once in a while.

I am well and safe and enjoy Italy, so don't worry. We will all be home soon.
