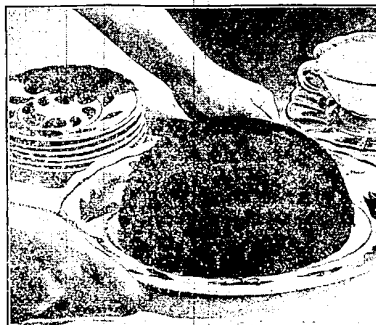

Give Your Meal a Happy Ending

CEREAL steamed pudding is a dessert that is easy to make, simply delicious . . . and as if that weren't enough, it is very considerate of those precious points. Today might be a very good time to make this dessert supreme that will be greeted with cheers by your entire family.

There's nothing that can make a meal seem more unimportant than a thoughtless ending. So try to avoid that dull habit of serving just a few tried and true recipes constantly and add this winner to your dessert list.

Cereal Steamed Pudding
1 cup sifted flour
1/2 cup grape-nuts
1/2 teaspoon soda
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon baking powder
1 egg, well beaten
1/2 cup molasses
1/2 cup milk

Sift flour once, measure, add soda, salt, mace, nutmeg, and cinnamon, and sift again. Add grape-nuts, and mix well. Combine egg, molasses, milk; add to flour mixture, stirring thoroughly. Turn into 1 1/2 pint mold, cover tightly. Steam 2 to 3 1/2 hours. If additional water is needed, add boiling water. Serves 6.

The Fire and the Wood—R. C. Hutchinson. This is a novel of Germany during 1932 and Josef uncouth in his cheap clothes and hobnail boots, a born schemer, impersonal, painstaking, sacrificing everything to give to the world a new discovery. Mina, a poor servant girl, is the subject for his human experiment. Mr. Hutchinson has never written with such clarity and dramatic power as in this study of the transformation of these two, the girl from a haunted, youthful simplicity to a woman of vision and courage, the man from an insensitive and almost brutal robot, to a lover of gentleness and an indomitable fighter.

As the Nazis come to power they are caught in the rush of muddles, passions, and violent events in Germany. They escape—and their individual tragedy becomes a hope for the world's future.

A great love story that never falters in its pace or suspense. There is the excitement of scientific exploration, the rush of terrifying events and the slow growth of two human souls from insensitivity to the world and to one another, to maturity, hope and transcendent love through sacrifice.

Capital City—Carl Sandz. The writer of this book has as interesting a background as could be possible and her sharp wit and tongue add much to the writing. The story is laid in the city of Franklin in the state of Kansas and opens with the third generation.

**SANDWICH FILLS
DETERMINE
SUCCESS OF LUNCH**

When those lunch boxes go swinging off to school, the layers between the bread slices determine whether upturned noses or eager grins will mark the opening of the lunch.

For variety, there's a long list that can be named for sandwich fillers. One such list contains 23 suggestions offered by the home economics extension service at Michigan State College.

Cheese combinations can include cottage cheese or cream cheese with jam or jelly, or American cheese with pimiento and with pickles.

Other fillings include combinations of egg with green pepper, relish or thousand island dressing, celery with cucumber, nuts or olives, peanut butter with pickles, apple sauce, jam, banana, or lettuce or chopped figs, cherries, dates, nuts with pineapple juice.

Salmon salad can go with eggs and pickles, dates and nuts can be used as a filling, lettuce can be dressed up with some preferred

type of dressing.

Sandwich makers can use dried beef, liver loaf, bacon, tomato, fried egg, baked beans, jam or jelly, Spanish onion, sardines, sausage, tomato, banana, left-over ground meat or vegetable mixtures.

With these suggestions or any others, the authorities point out, it is best to get an opinion of preferences and check up after the lunch to see which sandwiches would again be desirable.

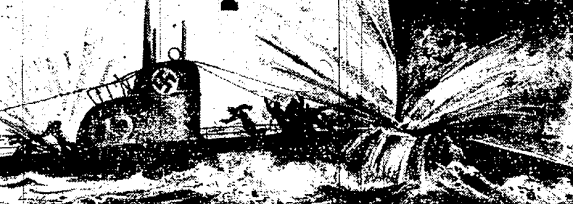
