Lowly Fanweed Yields Oil Of Economic Importance

Chemists have struck new sources of oil in the rank and lowly fanweed. Prof. H. O. Triebold and J. R. Clopton, agricultural biochemists at the Pennsylvania State college, have discovered that fanweed or pennycress seed is about one-third oil, of a quality that may be of great economic importance.

The properties of fanweed oil are similar to those of rapeseed oil which has been used in blending lubricating oil for high temperature work.

In 1940 nearly 13 million pounds of rapeseed oil were imported into the United States, about nine-tenths of it from Japan. Fanweed oil may prove to be an acceptable substitute, suitable not only for high quality lubrication but also in rubber substitute, in paints and varnishes as a drying oil, and as an edible oil.

Fanweed oil and rapeseed oil are similar in the high content of erucic acid which their glycerides contain and in changes of viscosity at ordinary temperatures. Both oils provide stickiness and elasticity, when added to mineral oils, which improve the protective coating given by the oil to moving bearings.

Hang Garments

Always hang garments on hangers—straight, and with top buttons fastened, collars and shoulders won't drag. Skirts should be hung from the waistband. Properly hung and so placed in the closet that there is space and air about each garment, some of the wrinkles acquired in wearing will "hang out," and less frequent pressing is necessary.

Vigual Area

Because man depends so much upon his eyes for knowledge and understanding, the visual area of the brain, situated in the cerebrum at the rear of the brain, is much more highly developed than in other animals, says the Better Vision Institute. The visual area in the human brain is larger than the hearing area, which is located in the temporal lobe.
