Pot Can't Be Grown In Canada

Q. A friend has a bet with me. He says that you can grow marijuana legally in Canada without being prosecuted. He says that even if you tell the Canadian government, they won't bother you. This is too much to believe. Can he possibly be right?

A. Well, as with most rumors, there's an element of truth in what your friend is saying. First of all, it is absolutely illegal to grow marijuana in Canada.

As for telling the government without being prosecuted, it all depends on which branch of the government you tell.

This story first began to circulate after some Canadian farmers freely admitted to census takers that they were growing the weed on part of their acreage as a cash crop. Some of the census people revealed this fact, but refused to divulge any names. They felt that the confidentiality of information was not to be violated.

As a matter of fact, they became quite concerned when a number of farmers got busted. Fortunately (for the census takers), none of the farmers who were caught had given such information during the census.

Definitely, the branch of government not to tell is the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. They are charged with tracking down such things, and do so with vigor.

The whole question is really a academic: Canadian marijuana is about the world's worst. It's just too cold there to cultivate a meaningful crop.

Q. What do you know about the Canadian government favoring the legalization of marijuana?

A. (We don't know if the sudden appearance of questions about other countries is a coincidence or if we should start opening branches in principal cities around the world.)

The Canadian government has not taken a position favoring the legalization of marijuana. A commission formed to study this question has favored legalization. The government itself gives every indication of wishing the report would just disappear quietly.

It's one thing to favor such action (as the commission did), but another thing to implement this decision (as the government would have to do). The problem is really complex: Legalization would create at least as many problems as it would solve. Resolving the problem is not, to say the least, a priority item with my friends across the border.

Medicare Signup Time Here

People who are 65 and haven't already signed up for the medical insurance part of Medicare may enroll now through March 31 at the social security office at 17500 Lahser, Detroit.

The medical part of Medicare helps pay the doctor bills for people 65 and over. "Almost everyone 65 and over is eligible," according to Sam F. Test, social security district manager of the Detroit - northwest office. "Most people who didn't sign up in their original enrollment period can sign up now," he said.

"You have seven months to sign up for the medical insurance part of the Medicare the first time," Test said. "You can sign up during the three months before you're 65, during the month you reach 65, or during the three months after you're 65."

THE MEDICAL insurance program is the voluntary part of Medicare. Persons who enroll in it are required to pay monthly premiums that are matched by the federal government.
