MENUS PLANNED FOR SCOUT DAY CAMP

Plans are going forward for the Girl Scout Day Camp, which is to open to all girls whether they are Scouts or not, between the ages of seven and 18. The Day Camp will be held for four days, June 26, 27, 28 and 29, between the hours of 9:30 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. at the City Park on Shilwassee.

This week the menus have been planned for the four days. The intermediates will bring their own nose bag lunch from home for the first day. The second day they will have stew, and toast marshmallows over an open fire for dessert. The third day they will have bacon and scrambled eggs, with potatoes, which each girl will fry in her own individual frying pan. Each girl will bring a cold boiled potato from home for this meal. The fourth and last day of camp they will have noodles, tuna fish, peas and mushroom soup, which they will pour over toasted bread.

The Brownies have a different menu than that arranged for the intermediates. The first day of camp they will each bring a nose bag lunch from home. The second day they will roast frankfurters wrapped in bacon, baked potatoes, graham crackers and marshmallows. The third day they will have bacon and eggs and bisquit scones. The fourth and last day they will have alternate cubes of bologna and tomatoes roasted on a stick, raw vegetables, bread and butter, and fresh fruit which they will bring from home.

The girls will do most of the cooking themselves, over an open fire, with one main dish which they will prepare as a group, so that in case it rains they can cook their meal indoors. Milk will be available each day, and may be purchased for five cents a bottle.

CLARENCEVILLE SCHOOLS GIVEN FEDERAL AID

Clarenceville Public Schools are in receipt of a telegram, stating that the school will receive \$6,083 for maintenance and operation of the schools from the Federal Government.

This money is provided to communities where the population has shown a sharp increase, due to war production, and is to be used for equipment, maintenance and extra teachers that were added at the beginning of the school year, in order to adequately take care of the new students.

William E. Footlander

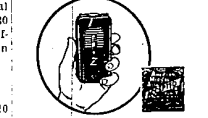
