VICTORY

MEATS, FATS—Red stamps AS through ZS, AS, BS and CS good indefinitely.

PROCESSED FOODS — Blue stamps AS through ZS through FS good indefinitely.

SUGAR—Sugar stamps 30, 31 and 32, each good for five pounds indefinitely. Sugar stamp 40, good for five pounds of granular sugar through February, next year.

GASOLINE—In 17 East Coast States, A-11 coupons, good through November 8, in States outside the East Coast area, A-12 coupons, good through September 21.

FUEL OIL—Period 4 and 5 coupons, good through September 30. New period 1 coupons now good.

SHOES—Airplane stamps 1 and 2, good indefinitely.

Farm Inflationary Signs

Elements that might contribute to inflation continue to be seen at the end of the second quarter of this year compared to the end of the same period last year, according to data made available by the Bureau of Agricultural Economics. Demand deposits in Country Banks, consisting largely of checking accounts, were up 23 percent—an increase partly accounted for by large deposits of Government funds. These checking accounts would be inflationary if used to bid up the price of land and scarce goods. Another inflationary sign is that average per-acre value of Farm Real Estate as of July 1 was up 15 percent over a year ago. For the quarter, cash receipts from Farm marketings were up six percent over a year ago and prices paid by Farmers for the things they buy—including interest and taxes—were up five percent. The only non-inflationary factor, more than offset by increased receipts from Farm marketings, was a decline of one percent in prices received by Farmers.

This One For You Kids
More low cost candy and better price control for candy are two of the aims of the Office of Price Administration in setting up four new Advisory Committees of Candy Manufacturers. Just in case you kids are interested, these manufacturers represent "General Line Candy," "Candy Bars," "Packaged Goods" and "Wholesale Candy."

Potato Prices Up 90 Cents
To compensate for a substantial reduction in yield due to drought, OPA has increased maximum prices of potatoes at the shipping point during August 80 cents a hundred pounds in 16 States—including real cost of potatoes grown in these States about one cent a pound. The increase was granted for potatoes produced in Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Ohio, West Virginia, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, Tennessee and Kentucky.

Tires For Farm Vehicles
Because Farm Vehicles must be kept in service, they may be equipped with used truck tires if available, as well as with used passenger tires, OPA announces.

Most Beef To Be Ration-Free
Beginning next Monday, August 14, all beef will be ration free except Commercial, good and choice steaks and roasts, WPA has announced.

Recruit Quarter Of Million Men
Treatment of Syphilis is responsible for the presence in the Armed Forces of 125,000 men who otherwise would have been unfit for Service, and for making 140,000 others available for service unless otherwise disqualified, the U.S. Public Health Service reports. Among the first 15 million Selective Service Registrants given Blood Tests, evidence of Syphilis was found among 720,000. Selective Service Boards, State and Local Health Departments, Army and Navy cooperated in tracing, treating and inducing infected Regs. to enlist.

School Teacher Now Cadet Nurse
After seven years teaching all grades in "The Little Red Schoolhouse," Rita Turner, Lin. Mo., took her opportunity to get help in achieving her life-long ambition to become a Nurse by being among the first to enlist in the U.S. Cadet Nurse Corps. Indianapolis Symphony

Subsidized by City

Good music at 40 cents an admission for all persons in the community is the object of a tax investment in a cultural experiment by the municipal government and the city school board in Indianapolis. The two governments contributed \$25,000 each to subsidize the Indianapolis Symphony orchestra this year, and the city will receive receipts from eight popular priced concerts.

From four concerts held, \$3,300 was taken in with a net income to the city of \$1,200, according to the Indianapolis City Managers association. Since some of the remaining four public concerts will be held in the Coliseum, which has a much greater seating capacity than halls used previously, city officials believe the eight concerts will return at least \$10,000 annually to the city.

Since eight free programs will be given for the city's school children, the school district does not expect to get back any of its \$25,000.

The Indianapolis Symphony orchestra is one of the few in the nation receiving municipal grants. In San Francisco \$40,000 is allotted for which the orchestra plays during the ballet season, and in Baltimore \$50,000 is granted for five concerts. In neither case does the city participate in the gate receipts; in Indianapolis all receipts from the series will revert to the city treasury.

Bessarabia Long Buffer

For International Politics

Bessarabia has long figured in international jockeying as a buffer corridor. Across its broad open spaces swept one migration after another—"big name" tribes such as Goths, Huns, Mongols; and less publicized wanderers such as the Bessi who gave the region its name. Romans made the land an outpost of empire, conquerors came and went. Conquest eclipsed colonization until modern times.

First widely settled under Tatar rule, Bessarabia is now peopled with Rumanians, Ukrainians, Bulgarians, Germans, Poles, Greeks, Turks, Armenians and Jews. Population totals about 3,000,000.

In the 16th century Bessarabia was tossed back and forth between Crimean Tatars and Turks. Later caused Turkish and Russian rulers to quarrel. Held by Russia for more than a century, Bessarabia was shifted to Rumania in the World War adjustments in 1918. Soviet Russia never acknowledged the transfer, occupied the country in 1940, lost it in 1941 when Germans teamed with Rumanians in invasion.

Bessarabia is about as big as New Hampshire and Massachusetts combined, resembles the topography of the American Middle West, has fertile soil, is a country of farmers. Nine-tenths of its land was used for growing wheat, barley, oats and Indian corn. Soybeans, sugar beets, potatoes, tobacco, and fruits were raised in quantities, filled the home market, and on the domestic stock in trade. Bessarabian oats and barley were major exports to Germany, its best customer.
