Raleigh House Will Expand

Ground will be broken for the \$2.5 million expansion of Raleigh House next Monday afternoon, Feb. 21 at 5:30 p.m. In announcing the date for the ceremonies, General Manager Sammy Lieberman stated that the expansion will include three public dining units - an English Pub, an Elizabethan Dining Room and a Miami-style Coffee Shop. Along with these will be an additional dining hall capable of seating 1,000 persons.

The new rooms are to be completed by fall, and Raleigh House officials explained, "This is just the beginning. Our ultimate goal is a 300-room hotel which will be added to the current facilities at an additional cost of \$7 million."

The Elizabethan dining room will seat 156 persons in a plush atmosphere where patrons will receive European style service at the table. For authenticity, the furnishings will be purchased in London, England.

The English Pub will seat 127 persons. An authentic oaken bar, to encircle a piano, will be shipped from England. With the new dining hall, the seating capacity at Raleigh House will be increased to 3,200.

G. Doyle Dodge of Birmingham was appointed deputy county chairman for organization for the Republican Party of Oakland County.

The appointment was announced by GOP County Chairman Sheldon Smith, who described Dodge as a "skilled organizer and experienced political leader."

He has served as organization director, director chairman of the voter identification program, chairman for research and issues, personal coordinator for the Birmingham area, and has been a delegate to the county and state Republican conventions.

'Prophet' Alive With 6 Disciples

You don't very often see a high school class with only six students - particularly a journalism class charged with publishing a high school paper - but Clarencville High School has one.

Following a mass exodus from its journalism class after the Clarencville Board of Education adopted guidelines to govern the paper, Clarencville High School Principal Ray Renbarger and Sup. David B. McDowell have decided to continue the class even though only six students are officially enrolled.

The decision to continue the class - the smallest at Clarencville High School - was made Wednesday, about two weeks after the new semester began there.

WHEN THE BOARD was considering guidelines proposed by Renbarger, several students from the journalism class attended the school board meeting and said they would not re-enroll in the class for the spring semester if the guidelines were adopted.

Floyd Kucharski, the journalism class teacher and adviser to The Prophet which it published, told the school board, "The practical result of these guidelines is that there will be no journalism class."

Of the 20 students who were

in the class last fall, only four told Kucharski they would re-enroll under the paper's guidelines. Two other students also apparently enrolled although Renbarger said one of them is a "home teaching" student who has been ill and had not been attending school for some time.

McDowell had said that normally a class would be discontinued if its enrollment dropped below 15 students.

RENBARGER TOLD The Observer that the class will still be expected to publish the paper - which had drawn criticism for its content last term and led to the guidelines.

"I probably could have used Floyd (Kucharski) for a (hall) duty assignment, but we felt it would be a wiser decision to keep him in a class. These six students are very interested in putting out a paper," the principal said.
