

Spartan Skaters Crush Bentley For 8th Win

Undefeated Stevenson rolled past Bentley in Livonia prep hockey action, 6-1, and Churchill blitzed Catholic Central in a non-leaguer, 5-2. Franklin Climbs To Top Of Heap

The high flying Franklin eagles swept to their sixth consecutive victory and bounded into the No. 1 spot in the Northwest Suburban conference, with a 6-2 mark. The Patriots whipped Oak Park, 67-47.

Franklin was tied with front running John Glenn, but the Rockets were knocked off for the second straight week in a North Farmington upset with Raider Coach Ken Dean pulling a 64-61 win out of his bag of tricks. The Rockets now find themselves in second at 5-3.

"To say the least, I was very surprised at the Glenn upset," said Franklin Coach Bob Visser. "But I still firmly believe we have to do it ourselves."

THE PATRIOTS get their chance Friday when they meet Glenn on the Rocket court. Franklin toppled Glenn in the first round, 51-41.

"Glenn's only chance is to beat us," added Visser. "If we win, we clinch at least a share of the crown."

Franklin stands 10-3 overall while Glenn has slipped to a 9-

4 mark after winning its first six games.

Rick Gramb put the Patriots up on a free throw and a short jumper, and Franklin led at the end of the quarter, 13-11. It was 23-20 at the half and Franklin gradually pulled away in the third quarter with a 41-33 margin.

FRANKLIN edged Oak Park in the final period, 20-14, to coast to a 14-point win.

Tim Dietz hauled in 13 rebounds and Franklin led 13-11 at the end of the third quarter.

Bentley's 11-11 record
